1. Introduction

This Notice to Mariners has been issued to update mariners on the upcoming major component exchange which will take place within the Moray Offshore Windfarm (West) Limited (Moray West) site. The start date for works has been delayed, and works are now to take place in September/October 2026 and will last approximately 14 days (subject to weather).

The Moray West site is located on the Smith Bank in the Outer Moray Firth, approximately 22.5km from the Caithness coastline. The offshore wind farm site covers an area of approximately 225km². The offshore wind farm site is given in Figure 1 (wind farm boundary is red, export cables are blue).

The works comprise a transformer exchange which will be carried out at two locations: WTG EO8 and WTG L09 (Table 1). The works will be carried out utilising the jack-up vessel “Wind Peak” which will be required onsite for the duration of the works, with client reps in place throughout. There will be a ERRV (Emergency Response & Rescue Vessel) in the field 24 hours a day to provide cover for the JUV and an additional CTV for support. Details of these vessels will be updated once confirmed and communicated in a future NtM.

Figure 1. Moray West Wind Farm Site.

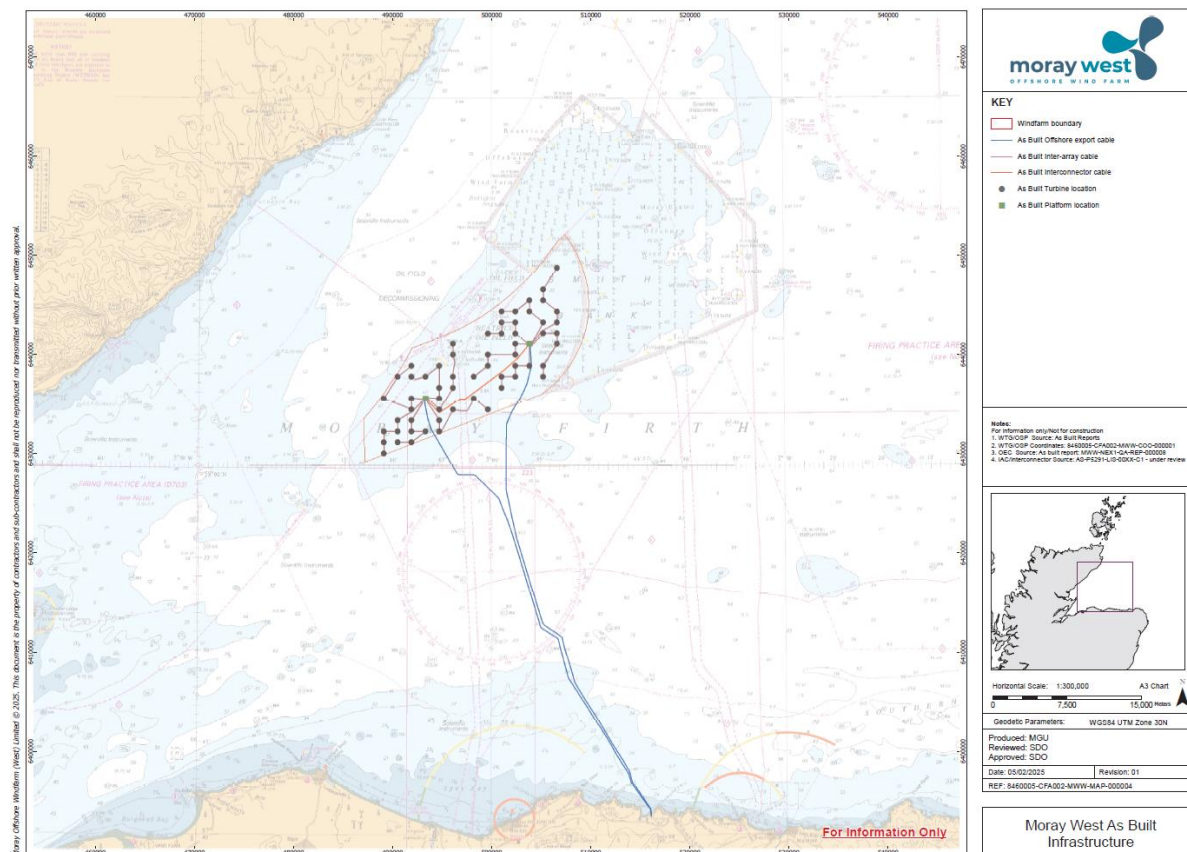

2. General safety advice

Please be aware that, during the major exchange activities, by virtue of its mode of operation the Wind Peak will be Restricted in its Ability to Manoeuvre (RAM) as defined under COLREGs (International Regulations for Preventing Collisions at Sea 1972, Rule 3). Masters of vessels are therefore requested to maintain their vessels and gears at a minimum safe passing distance from the vessel of 500 metres when it is undertaking work and showing the appropriate shapes and lights in accordance with COLREGs Rule 27.

In order to not compromise the safety of the vessel and their crew, and the ability to undertake its contracted works, fishermen who have static fishing gears deployed within 500 m from the WTG where major repairs are planned (see Table 1) are requested to provide the coordinates of such deployed gears in DMS and details of whether the surface markers used are visible at all states of visibility to Alex Winrow-Griffin (Brown & May Marine) using the contact information below (Section 58 of the Merchant Shipping Act 1995). Fishermen who have static gears deployed beyond 12 nm are reminded that static gear must be marked in accordance with Commission Implementing Regulation (EU) No. 404/2011 (<https://www.legislation.gov.uk/eur/2011/404/title/II/chapter/III>).

The Scottish Ministers have authorised the establishment of a 500-metre radius safety zone around all major maintenance works being undertaken. The safety zone will be active when the jack-up vessel involved in undertaking major maintenance works is attached to, or anchored next to, the WTG. No more than one 500 metre major maintenance safety zone will be active at any given time. All mariners are requested to give a wide berth to all vessels involved in the major repair activities. Mariners are requested to navigate with caution, to use all means appropriate to aid safe navigation as defined under COLREGs Rule 7 and keep continued watch on VHF Ch. 16 when navigating the area.
